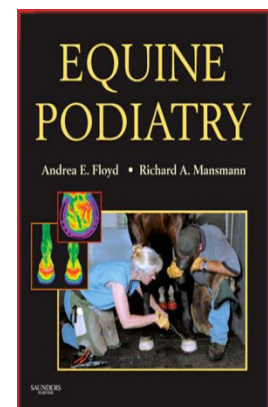
BETHANY COLLEGE EQUESTRIANS

RACEHORSE HOUSING AT PPEC

Peace Point Equestrian Center is working in conjunction with Williams Racing Corp. to adopt the West Virginia bred raiser program. With this program, any weanling that is brought into West Virginia by January 1st, 2008 and stays for an entire year will qualify as a West Vir-

ginia bred Thoroughbred. This gives them the opportunity to earn an extra 40 cents on every dollar earned in their West Virginia racing career. There are currently ten weanlings living at Peace Point as part of this project. Once these weanlings start their racing career, Peace Point

will receive a percentage of their winnings. These weanlings are also being used in some of the college classes, so that students can learn how to work with young horses.

PETER CAMPBELL CLINIC

ners" video series that has been sold and seen worldwide. He has also appeared at international events like the Canadian Finals Rodeo and the Spruce Meadows Masters. He is frequently on "Horse TV" and the "Horseman's Radio Weekly". Camp-

bell has been featured in many publications including Western Horseman, Northern Horse Review, and Trails Less Traveled. Campbell will be hosting a clinic at Peace Point on September 12th - 14th.
